



Historic Resources Definitions

National Register Listed – These sites are listed on the National Register of Historic Places overseen by the National Park Service and administered by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission. These can be historic buildings, structures, sites, objects and historic districts (please note historic districts within Allegheny County were not mapped due to the unavailability of data).

National Register Listed and City Designated – These sites are listed on the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission’s National Register as well as designated as historically significant by the City of Pittsburgh Historic Review Commission.

National Historic Landmark – These are nationally significant historic places and are designated by the Secretary of the Interior. These sites possess exceptional value or quality in illustrating or interpreting the heritage of the United States.

National Historic Landmark and City Designated – These sites are on both the National Historic Landmark list as well as designated by the City of Pittsburgh Historic Review Commission.

City of Pittsburgh Designated Historic Landmark – These sites are designated historically significant by the City of Pittsburgh Historic Review Commission. National Register Eligible – These sites meet the criteria to be listed on the National Register, but have not been listed at this time.

National Register Eligible and City Designated - These sites meet the criteria to be listed on the National Register, but have not been listed at this time. They are designated as historically significant by the City of Pittsburgh Historic Review Commission.

City of Pittsburgh Historic Districts – These are multiple buildings within a street or a whole neighborhood that is designated historically significant by the City of Pittsburgh Historic Review Commission.
